



Why did we write these books?


Autism is underdiagnosed.

- Clinicians don't feel qualified to diagnose
- Cultural factors overlooked

Not getting a diagnosis has mental health consequences.

A note about culture

- Important to acknowledge the intersection of culture and autism.
- Our cultural experiences and identity is intertwined with our broader experience.
- Not a deep dive into all aspects of cultural considerations – an attempt to offer perspective
- Just Ask!

Clinician advisory board


Family & professional focus groups

How is this book different?

- Aimed at a general audience, easy-to-read!
- What the research says
- What autistic people say (lived experience)
 - Not just one person
 - Breadth of experiences
- Provides guidance for cultural humility

We each have different traits (ways the brain processes information)

Each person has a **unique** mixture of abilities and challenges



Diagnostic Criteria

Social/Communication challenges (need all 3)

- Reciprocal interactions
- Nonverbal communication
- Relationship management

Repetitive/restricted behaviors (need at least two)

- Repetitive or unusual behavior
- Inflexibility
- Interests
- Sensory

Current or by history

Co-Occurring Challenges

- Emotional
- Cognitive
- Physical
- Other
 - Adaptive functioning
 - Dating & cultural norms
 - Gender & attraction


Autistic strengths mirror the criteria
